WHAT IS THE FELLOWSHIP? This program provides select students who will have completed their junior year of high school the chance to work (as a CIT) in one of Yachad's various camp programs for one session (approximately, three to four weeks) during the summer. You will gain intensive leadership training and hands-on experience working for Yachad. Fellows will be supervised by the fellowship program director as well as the individual camp program director, and will have junior counselor responsibilities within the larger framework of the Yachad camp program in that individual camp.

The Fellowship will take place in the four Yachad camp programs: Camp Neshet, Camp Lavi, Camp Morasha, and Camp Moshava.

- ➔ Participate in one training Shabbaton prior to the summer (required)
- ➔ Attend periodic meetings and trainings during the summer together with other fellowship participants in other camp programs (required)
- ➔ Attend additional special programs
